Recommended Sequence: First year (fall semester) - FS 101 or 101H, 104 and 110 first year (spring semester) – FS 107 and 111 and COMM 171; second year (fall semester) - FS 116 and 118 and FS 173/ENG 173; second year (spring semester) – FS 120 and elective course.

Associate Degree Graduation Requirements: (1) Complete all department requirements with a “C” or better in each course. Candidates for an Associate Degree are also required to complete at least 20% of the department requirements through SBCC. Pass/No Pass grading is not permitted in those courses needed to fulfill department requirements; (2) Complete at least 18 units of General Education Requirements ([Areas A-D](#) of the SBCC General Education pattern); (3) Complete the SBCC Institutional Requirements ([Area E](#)); (4) Complete the Information Competency Requirement ([Area F](#)); (5) Complete a total of 60 degree-applicable units (SBCC courses numbered 100 and higher); (6) Maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better in all units attempted at SBCC; (7) Maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better in all college units attempted; and (8) Candidates for an Associate Degree are required to complete 15 units through SBCC.

Associate in Arts Degree in Film Studies

The Film Studies major, leading to an AA degree, focuses on historical and critical studies in the field of film. The program is designed to introduce students to film literature and criticism and to provide them with a basic knowledge of motion picture history, including the work of major American and international directors. Electives enhance this course of study by exposing students to the principles, technology and techniques of motion picture production. The goal of the program is to encourage a critical attitude toward moving image media through theoretical studies, critical analysis and historical and cross-cultural examination.

Careers in Film Studies

Graduates of the Film Studies program have the knowledge and skills to enter careers as professionals in the fields of film, video, television and digital media. Depending on the area of specialization they choose to pursue through their electives, students graduate with training to work as screenwriters, cinematographers, directors, editors, and/or producers. Graduates are also qualified to continue their studies of film in a four-year college or university. The Film Studies program at SBCC has an excellent record of course articulation and student transfer to the University of California, Santa Barbara and campuses throughout the CSU system as well as top four-year film schools such as UCLA, USC, AFI and Cal Arts.
