

Course Repeat Payment Policy

New Policy Effective Beginning Spring 2012

Due to Change in Federal Regulations

PAYMENT OF FEDERAL FINANCIAL AID FUNDS FOR PREVIOUSLY REPEATED COURSES

Due to new federal regulations, there is a limitation on the number of times federal financial aid funds can be used to pay for a previously passed course. Previously passed courses not paid aid are included.

- This policy applies to federal funds including Pell Grant, SEOG, Direct Subsidized and Unsubsidized Loans and Parent Loans
- Students can only repeat a previously passed course one time and be paid federal financial aid funds for it.
- A grade of “D” or better is considered passing for these purposes.
- After passing a course, another repetition of the same course where a student receives a letter grade or a Pass or No Pass counts as repeating the course. A “Withdrawal” from the course after passing the course does not constitute repeating the course.
- This policy does not limit the number of times a student can repeat a course not passed. Refer to college regulations on limitations on repeating a course.
