

Honors Program Application Santa Barbara City College

Fall Semester: Filing period June 1st – July 15th for high school students. Spring grades must be included.

Fall Semester: Filing period May 1st – July 15th for students with 12 college units completed and 3.0 GPA (continuing SBCC students or transfer students). Incomplete applications will not be accepted.

Any complete applications received between July 16th-August 14th will be reviewed on a rolling basis.

Spring Semester: Filing period October 15th-December 8th. Incomplete applications will not be accepted.

Any complete applications received between December 9th-January 15th will be reviewed on a rolling basis.

Minimum eligibility: New students entering from high school must have an overall high school GPA of 3.0 with no grade below a "C" in an academic subject. Students with previous college credit must have a GPA of 3.0 with at least 12 units of academic college course work with no grade below a "C" in an academic subject OR may be admitted on the basis of high school transcripts. All students must demonstrate eligibility for English 110* and Math 107#. (See below for details)
